Hereford Proposed University

The plans for the NMitie University are proceeding well and the support from Government via the Local Enterprise Partnership continues forward. There is still a way to go but the county is looking for students in place during 2019.

Road building Hereford Link road

Is progressing on schedule for opening next October. At its junction with the A49, two-way traffic will operate at all times, the lanes on the A49 may move as the construction progresses. Remember Widemarsh Street continues to remain one way for a period and the route is well signed. This new road opens up a significant area for development and will alleviate some traffic in Newmarket Street which will become single lane two way traffic as part of the city centre upgrades.

South Wye Transport package (SWTP)

The planning for this road continues positively. Some questions have been raised again over the funding for SWTP. I have made this clear on many occasions. The Dept. of Transport are funding this to the tune of £27 million through the LEP bid made at the start of the project. It is a retained scheme and as we progress through the development and the money for this scheme cannot be allocated to anything else in Herefordshire or the wider LEP area.

Land required for the project is currently being assembled to progress the project, since planning permission was gained in June 2016.

Hereford Bypass

Route options for the Hereford Bypass to the west of Hereford continue. The route starts at the western end roundabout of the Southern Link road (Phase1 of bypass) and to the A49 at Holmer in the north. Strategic housing sites along this route are now coming forward in the planning system for determination in due course. This is consistent with the Core strategy.

Neighbourhood plans

Current Neighbourhood plans for adoption following referendum are Breinton, Callow and Haywood, Kingston and Thruxton, Weston Beggard, Bartestree and Lugwardine and Whitbourne. These were added to the County map post 1st December.

Care Quality Commission (CQC) praise for Herefordshire

Herefordshire Council and Herefordshire Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) have been praised by inspectors for improving the support for children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities. Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) carried out a joint inspection between 26 and 30 September, to judge the county's effectiveness in identifying and meeting the needs of children and young people with special educational needs and / or disabilities (SEND), in line with the Children and Families Act 2014.

As part of the inspection, inspectors spoke with children and young people with SEND and their families and council, CCG and school representatives along with visiting a range of education providers to see how they're implementing the special educational needs reforms.
