

Deloitte Ride across Britain – 9th-17th September 2017 - Event summary

The event is a multi-day leisure cycle ride (not a competitive race) and is made up of nine stages starting at Land's End and finishing at John O'Groats. There will be up to 800 riders on the event each day and each stage starts in the early morning and finishes in the early evening. The riders are set-off from the start of each stage in groups of approximately 50, and at three minute intervals, so as to minimise the impact on the road network. Local Highways Maintenance Challenge Fund

The Department for Transport has awarded Herefordshire Council £5 million from the Challenge Fund for funding for major maintenance to the cross-county routes which provide access to Herefordshire's Enterprise Zone.

These routes connect to Hereford's Southern Link Road route. They include the A465 Hereford to South Wales, the A438 to Mid-Wales and the A4103 to Worcestershire and onto the West Midlands. The Enterprise Zone and all routes included in the bid are Midlands Connect Strategic Economic Hubs and Corridors. This work would help Herefordshire to power the Midlands Engine through the maintenance of routes that connect Herefordshire's Enterprise Zone. BBLP have already started to put their plans into action.

Hereford City Centre Improvements – Hereford City Centre Order 2016 - On Street Parking

To introduce pay & display parking (8am – 6pm Monday to Saturday, maximum stay 2 hour, no return within 2 hours) in place of the existing general use limited waiting parking places in: Aubrey Street, Bridge Street, Broad Street, Gaol Street, Harrison Street, King Street, St. John Street and St. Owen's Street. The proposed charges are 50p for stays of up to 30 minutes, £1 for stays of up to 1 hour and £2.50 for stays of up to 2 hours. Note a 36p convenience charge applies for payments by phone.

To allow all vehicles to use the loading bays in the following roads: Bewell Street, Broad Street, Gaol Street, St. Peter's Square, Union Street and West Street and to standardise the maximum stay period to 30 minutes and the no return period to 2 hours (loading in some bays is currently restricted to goods vehicles and/or bullion vehicles). Work will be carried out over a weekend period towards the end of this year.
